

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Overarching Objectives

- The criminal-legal system is a complex, multi-layered network (police, courts, jails, prisons, community supervision)
- The Economic Research Resource Center will provide tools, evidence, & support to help identify care models that are both effective & sustainable
- We will collaborate with the CTC, MAARC, and CERRCs to ensure:
 - Economic evaluations & tools are tailored to the unique needs & constraints of each setting
 - Policymakers & stakeholders at all levels can make informed decisions on how best to utilize their limited resources to maximize access to evidence-based SUD care

Aim 1

- Support Hubs by providing guidance on designing, implementing, analyzing, & translating prospective economic evaluations
 - Structured Needs Assessment with all Hubs
 - Evaluate proposed economic analysis
 - Identify the economic research capacity and priorities
 - HEAT (Health Economic Analytic Team) 2.0
 - Will consist of lead economic investigators from across the Consortium
 - Investigators can share updates, seek advice, and explore collaboration opportunities
 - Implementation Science Collaborative
 - In collaboration with CTC & CERRCs, we will convene implementation science leads from all Hubs
 - Ensure econ and IS data are collected in a manner that meets the needs of both groups, while minimizing research partner burden

Aims 2 – 4

- Conduct health economic research to inform complex “real-world” decisions
 - Distributional cost-effectiveness analysis (DCEA) to evaluate costs and benefits of interventions or policies across population subgroups
 - Develop a financial sustainability toolkit for SUD service providers who treat individuals with criminal-legal involvement, in and outside of carceral settings
 - Identify new questions
- Develop and disseminate tools/resources for practitioners & policymakers to inform decisions about the budget impact of alternative SUD care strategies, & the design of payment systems
- Provide ad hoc economic analysis consultation and technical assistance




Figure 1. Continuum of Community Engagement in Research

Engagement and Support Core/Aim 1

- Strengthen JCOIN science by rigorously integrating expertise and perspectives of people with lived experience (PWLE)

Research Capacity Building Core/Aim 2

- Engage a new cadre of scientists and staff with lived experience by addressing barriers to participation & leadership in addiction research.

Dissemination Core/Aim 3

- Create public resources that will enable PWLE and institutions to participate in community-engaged research on incarceration and addiction.


Rapid Research Core/Aim 4

Identify opportunities for public health graduates of prison education programs in hubs
